AMR Industry Alliance	The AMR Industry Alliance is a coalition of over 100 biotechnology, diagnostics, generics, and research-based pharmaceutical companies and associations. The aim of the association is to offer sustainable solutions to curb antimicrobial resistance (AMR), which is increasingly threatening global health. The AMR Industry Alliance aims to achieve this by facilitating collaboration, reporting on industry contributions, and engaging with external stakeholders. Fresenius Kabi is part of the board of AMR Industry Alliance and engages in several actions to support the fight against AMR.	Industry association
International Generic and Biosimilar Association (IGBA)	The International Generic and Biosimilar Medicines Association (IGBA) represents global manufacturers of generic and biosimilar medicines. The portfolio of Medicines for Europe members supply over 70% of all medicines in Europe, and over the last ten years, generic medicines have increased access to medicines by over 100% in 7 key therapeutic areas and can thus help to ensure the sustainability of European healthcare systems for future generations. Association for Accessible Medicines	The Association for Accessible Medicines (AAM) and its Biosimilar Council division is a trade association representing generic and biosimilar pharmaceutical companies in the United States. Its primary goal is to improve access to safe, effective, and affordable medicines. The association works towards fostering a competitive market for generic and biosimilar drugs, advocating policies that enhance patient access, and promoting the economic sustainability of the pharmaceutical industry. Aktionsbündnis Patientensicherheit (Action Alliance for Patient Safety)	Aktionsbündnis Patientensicherheit is committed to safe healthcare and is dedicated to the research, development, and dissemination of suitable methods. Helios Germany is a member of the Action Alliance and part of the organization's interdisciplinary and multi-professional working and expert groups. The working groups meet regularly and publish their results in the form of recommendations for action, patient information, and publications, which are made available free of charge to all institutions in the German healthcare system, as well as patients and their relatives.	Public organization
Stay Healthy (Fundación Quirónsalud)	Awareness-raising campaign aimed at schools and young people. Experts from the Quirónsalud Helios Spain Foundation explain the benefits of healthy habits to the target group and draw attention to the main health risks. In 2024, we have had more than 1,360 registered centers and 35,000 students impacted through the virtual classroom and 583 sessions, as well as 72 centers and 12,450 students reached through in-person sessions, with 71 professionals volunteering. Fundación Quirónsalud	In the field of International Cooperation, the Quirónsalud Foundation has established an alliance with the ACOES a non-governmental organization whose objectives and purposes include promoting and supporting initiatives aimed at creating and developing living conditions and the comprehensive development of human beings in the most disadvantaged and marginalized sectors of the Honduran population. It particularly focuses on children, youth, and people with disabilities, prioritizing Education as an effective tool for development. The program serves more than 6,500 children, 4 schools, 23 daycare centers and educational reinforcement centers, 5 youth training centers, and over 150 elderly individuals.	Private organization
Fundación Quirónsalud	Patients can receive subsidies for medical care via the foundation if they have no financial resources. This is made possible by, among other things, an agreement with the energy company Naturgy. The energy savings resulting from the solar systems installed in Helios Spain's hospitals are donated to patients.	Private organization
Fundación Recover	The foundation focuses its efforts on improving the medical infrastructure in 11 sub-Saharan African countries (including Ethiopia, Burkina Faso, Cameroon and Chad), for example by providing medical equipment and medicines to enable treatment, supporting local medical staff, and promoting medical training. KabiCare from Fresenius Kabi	KabiCare® is a self-developed support program for training and information services for healthcare professionals and patients: it was developed to support people living with a chronic disease, e. g., cancer or inflammatory diseases, who are being treated with a biosimilar product from Fresenius Kabi.
Americares in cooperation with Fresenius Kabi	In the United States, Fresenius Kabi has a more than 10-year relationship with Americares, a health-focused relief and development organization that responds to people affected by poverty or disaster with life-changing medicine, medical supplies, health services, and programs. Fresenius Kabi does this through financial support and in-kind (product) donations for missions in both the United States and internationally. Further, Fresenius Kabi USA participates in charitable fundraising and awareness activities to support a variety of health-related causes, including breast cancer, AIDS blood donation, sickle cell disease, and postpartum mental health.
Tulipe in cooperation with Fresenius Kabi	In France, Fresenius Kabi works together with Tulipe for donations in kind. Tulipe, an initiative by Leem (Les Entreprises du Médicament), coordinates emergency medical aid through donations from 60 healthcare companies. It provides immediate relief and supports long-term health efforts in vulnerable regions. Tulipe mobilizes donations to crisis zones, partners with NGOs to distribute aid in countries like the DRC, Lebanon, Cameroon, and Ethiopia, and responds to natural disasters.
Starter program in cooperation with Fresenius Kabi	In Canada, the business segment also provides urgent anticoagulation treatment for out-of-hospital patients through the starter program (biosimilar to enoxaparine). They are provided with a free pack, which in Canada is equivalent to 5–10 days of treatment. The Compassionate Program extends ongoing anticoagulation therapy to patients without insurance coverage or financial resources and provides free medication for the entire duration of treatment.
JUMPstart in collaboration with Fresenius Kabi	JUMPstart is Fresenius Kabi's education and research program to help the next generation of clinical experts create high-quality research projects. Beyond providing education on effective study design and mentorship from expert senior researchers, the program cultivates an international community of researchers committed to advancing clinical nutrition therapy. There are two global programs: while JUMPstart Clinical Nutrition focuses on chronically and critically ill patients, JUMPstart Renal Nutrition Therapy focuses on patients with chronic kidney disease.
United for Clinical Nutrition founded by Fresenius Kabi	To overcome hospital malnutrition in countries around the world, in 2014 Fresenius Kabi established the initiative United for Clinical Nutrition. This multinational initiative seeks to reduce the prevalence of this condition through education, data collection, and clinical assessment in selected geographical regions. To this end, dedicated clinical projects and awareness campaigns have been tailored for Latin America (since 2014), Asia (since 2017), and Europe (since 2019). Its mission is to improve medical nutrition therapy and quality of life with a strong focus on better patient outcomes across the region. As part of the United for Clinical Nutrition initiative, Fresenius Kabi first announced the Parenteral Nutrition Research Grant Latin America (LAM Grant) in 2018 to promote research aimed at improving nutritional care of hospitalized adult patients in Latin America.
Cooperation between Helios Germany and the organization Friedensdorf International	Children from the organization Friedensdorf International are regularly treated in Helios clinics. Friedensdorf International brings sick and injured children from crisis and war zones, who have no chance of receiving adequate medical care in their home countries, to Germany to receive the treatment they need here. They are treated free of charge at Helios and receive follow-up treatment in Germany until they can return home.

The Quirónsalud Foundation has led the activation of collective actions launched to respond to the multiple needs arising from the DANA catastrophe in Valencia. More than 4,000 collaborators contributed their steps through “Cada Paso Cuenta” (Every steps counts), turning them into financial aid for affected colleagues, social organizations, and institutions to address urgent identified needs. A total of 106 centers from the Quirónsalud network and their teams participated in this initiative.
